





OVERVIEW OF BOND PROGRAM


- City has been working on Parks Master Plan since 2010
- Our leaders are committed to the goal of all residents being within walking distance of a green space (10-minute walk)
- On November 6, 2018, the General Obligation Parks Bond for \$150 million was passed by the voters
- This project represents the biggest capital program in our City
- City is encouraging participation from local vendors and suppliers
- Transparency and collaboration remain high priorities

PARKS AND RECREATION

Parks System Master Plan

The 2017 City of Doral Parks and Recreation Master Plan utilized 11 different analysis and engagement techniques including:

- 6 public workshops
- A community survey
- Focus groups
- Stakeholder interviews
- Multiple presentations

- Total program duration is anticipated to be 48 months

- Making sure work is progressing in a timely manner
- Pushing resolution of issues (not holding up the A/E or Contractor)





Cone of Silence

Sec. 2-11.1. – Miami-Dade County Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics Ordinance

The Cone of Silence prohibits any communication regarding a particular City solicitation (RFP, RFQ or bid) between potential bidders/proposers, the City's professional staff and the City's Council

Purchasing Thresholds

The City of Doral's Purchasing Ordinance states that:

- Purchases less than \$5,000 may be made or entered without submittal to the City Council and without competitive bidding
- Purchases more than \$5,000 but less than \$15,000 may be made or entered without submittal to the City Council and without competitive bidding but shall require that the Department obtain quotes from at least three different vendors
- Purchases in excess of \$15,000 shall be in compliance with the competitive bidding requirements



SOLICITATION PROCESS

Planning Phase – (6-8 weeks)

- Department performs market research and drafts scope of work
- Procurement reviews draft solicitations and provides feedback and forwards final draft to Risk Management for Insurance Requirements

Advertising Phase – (5-7 weeks)

- Final solicitation is advertised on the City's Procurement Website, DemandStar and Vendor Registry
- Mandatory Pre-bid Meeting (2-3 weeks after bid is advertised publicly); BE PUNCTUAL!!
- Bids are due in the City Clerks office <u>before</u> the opening time; Bids are opened publicly

Evaluating Phase – (3 weeks – 3 months)

- Procurement reviews all bids for responsiveness and responsibility
- Procurement contacts references for all firms
- Invitations to Bids (ITB) awarded based on the lowest responsive, responsible bidder (1-2 weeks)
- Request for Qualifications (RFQ) and Request for Proposals (RFP) Evaluated by a committee based on the points criteria set forth in solicitation document.



SOLICITATION PROCESS (con't.)

Evaluating Phase (con't.) – (3 weeks – 3 months)

- Committee meets to evaluate and score submittals; makes recommendation to award or phase II
- Highest ranking firms are invited to make presentation to committee
- Committee meets again, re-evaluates and scores; makes award recommendation (4-8 weeks)

Awarding Phase – (5-7 weeks)

- Procurement provides requesting department with the final award recommendation and all awarding documents
- Item is taken to our City Council meeting for approval of award recommendation and negotiation.
 Council meets on the second Wednesday of each month
- Upon approval, the user department engages awarded firm(s); drafts agreement and begin negotiations alongside the City Attorney's office
- After agreement is fully executed, vendor is given the Notice to Proceed (NTP) and Work Order

VENDOR REGISTRATION

In order for a vendor to be registered in Tyler Munis (financial system), the following documents are required:

- City of Doral Vendor Application
- Business Entity Affidavit
- W9 (updated)
- Local Business Tax Receipt (LBT/BTR)/Occupational License (City of Doral/MDC)
- Certificate of Insurance

SBE/DBE/VETERANS/LOCAL BUSINESSES COMPLIANCE

- Veterans owned, Small Business Enterprises, Disadvantage Business Enterprises and Local Business requirements will be clearly stated within the solicitation of each project
- Procedure to provide preference for Doral businesses and residents in public works and improvements contracts Ord. No. 2018-24, § 2, Sec. 2-325

PAYMENT PROCESS

- Quotes, estimates, or statements will NOT be used to pay an invoice
- State of Florida Prompt Payment Act; Net 30

PUBLIC WORKS

PUBLIC WORKS PROCESSES FOR PARKS BOND-RELATED PROJECTS:

- When parks bond-related projects initiate offsite improvements and/or when onsite ingress/egress (private road)/utility easement corridors are proposed as part of the project
- Public Works will be a part of the following processes during design and construction:
 - Plans review
 - Permitting
 - Inspections



PUBLIC WORKS

PUBLIC WORKS PROCESSES FOR PARKS BOND-RELATED PROJECTS:


- Permits will be issued by Public Works for dry runs (approval without a contractor), or for construction (approval with a contractor)
- All plans review, permitting, and inspection processes will be expedited for parks bond related projects
- Public Works plans review, engineering, and inspections staff will be available to assist design professionals, consultants, contractors, etc., with questions, concerns, and all other inquiries related to parks bond-related projects

PERMIT PROCESS

Who Can Apply For A Permit?

CONTRACTOR

- Must be licensed by the County or the State
- By Law must carry both property liability insurance and worker's compensation insurance





PERMITTING PROCESS

PLANS SUBMITTED

- Application must be complete
- 2 hard copies and CD with PDFs

PLANS REVIEWED

- Outside Agencies play role (FIRE, DERM, etc)
- Public Works & Zoning review

PERMIT ISSUED

Construction may begin

INSPECTIONS

Online via e-permitting site

PROJECT COMPLETE

- Final Inspections must be passed
- If applicable CO issued
